HUMAN RIGHTS

rights belonging to individuals as human beings

regardless of race, sex, nationality, etchnicity, language, religion or any other status



History - RIGHT TO PRIVACY

> UN Universal Declaration of Human Rights (1948)

Article 12

No one shall be subjected to **arbitrary interference** with his privacy, family, home or correspondence, nor to attacks upon his **honour and reputation**. Everyone has the right to the protection of the law against such interference or attacks.

International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966)

Article 17

- 1. No one shall be subjected to **arbitrary or unlawful interference** with his privacy, family, home or correspondence, nor to unlawful attacks on his honour and reputation.
- 2. Everyone has the right to the protection of the law against such interference or attacks.
