WHAT IS A MOBILITY PERIOD

Main characteristics of a mobility period



- Opportunity to study in another university, in person or online, work on a thesis, cooperate in a project or take an internship abroad
- ✓ On a voluntary basis
- Economic contribution
- Regulated by calls of application: plan well in advance!
- Heterogeneous duration and departures
- ✓ Different contact person/office depending on the call/on the programme





OUR TIPS


Start well in advance to prepare yourself: plan each step to avoid last minute problems!



Before applying for an exchange period:

- consider your study plan
- check the agreements between universities
- remember: each university
 has a different system
- discover if there are scholarships **incompatibilities**

In case of physical mobility:





OUR TIPS – STUDY PLAN

You are **actively involved** in the creation of your study plan!

- Look for information in the website of the University you are interested in
- Check which exams you may choose abroad (agreements between universities/departments)
- Compare it with the exams required in your study plan






- You will improve your level of autonomy
- You will boost your problem solving skills
- You will enhance your decision making skills



OUR TIPS – DIDACTIC ACTIVITIES

✓ Not all the exams offered by the partner university are available to exchange students



Check the **agreements** between university/departments Check the modality of enrolments to courses (e.g.: click days)

- ✓ Do you want to work on your thesis while in exchange?
- Plan wisely when you want to leave



Consider the organization of **academic years**, when your **residence permit** expires, when **exam sessions** are set



Plan ahead your exam session and consider to sit in Padua some exams as non attendant student.

 Check language requirements asked by hosting universities



Check the availability of the partner



<u>CLA</u> organises <u>language courses</u> for exchange students who have been selected for a mobility period. Remember you can obtain <u>language</u> <u>certifications</u> from CLA.

OUR TIPS - PHYSICAL MOBILITY: RESIDENCE PERMIT

Do you have a RESIDENCE PERMIT to stay in Italy?



When you leave for a mobility period you should have a **residence permit in Italy valid** for the period of your staying abroad



Pay attention to the **expiry date** of your residence permit



Plan your mobility period when your residence permit is valid



Consider to **renew** it well in **advance**

OUR TIPS - PHYSICAL MOBILITY: VISA

Would you need a VISA, a Residence Permit for the country of destination, both or some other paperworks?



- VISA release could take some time
- Get information well in advance about **required**documents
- Be prepared: you will be asked for a proof of financial means

Each situation is different



Get information from your hosting University and from the National Organisation's website of the country of destination



Check the requirements contacting the relevant **embassy/consulate** in Italy





Be sure you consider all the FINANCIAL ASPECTS when you decide to apply for a period abroad!

- ✓ You will not be asked to pay tuition fees at the hosting university.
- Evaluate if you are moving to a high spending or low spending destination.

But there is the possibility you will be asked for a fee.



Check in advance with the hosting university

Remember you need to look for an accommodation abroad.

In some countries there is a crisis of accommodation.




Check in advance if the hosting university offers an accommodation to exchange students



OUR TIPS - PHYSICAL MOBILITY: FINANCIAL ASPECTS



✔ Don't rely only on the mobility scholarship



The grant is divided into **two installment**: the first one, which can be paid up to **60 days** after the beginning of the mobility period, and the second one, paid after **the end** of the exchange period

- Proof of finance: document released by Erasmus Office, useful for VISA request (not available for departure in I semester: information about scholarships not published yet).
- The grant depends on the achievement of a minimum number of credits.
 - E.g.: Erasmus programme: at least 12 credits; Ulisse programme: at least 3 credits

- You can apply for additional contributions.
 These are defined each year and can change according to ISEE and merit
- ✓ The amount of the scholarship is established according to the actual months you spent abroad

approximately 11.200 euro/year

CZECH REPUBLIC

approximately 1.524 euro/year

Be prepared in advance:

- ✓ consider all the academic aspects
- ✓ ponder financial aspects
- take in consideration the expiry date of your
 residence permit
- ✓ in case you need a visa, obtain information in advance
- ✔ follow the instructions provided by the Mobility Office!
